

ACP Helps Low-Income Households Pay for Internet Service and Devices

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) helps low-income households pay for broadband service and internet connected devices. ACP is a program of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). It replaces the Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) program.

If your household is eligible, you can receive:

- Up to a \$30 per month discount on your internet service
- Up to a \$75 per month discount if your household is on qualifying Tribal lands
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (may require a co-payment of \$10 to \$50)

Only one monthly service discount and one device discount is allowed per household. To receive the connected device discount, consumers need to enroll in the ACP with a participating provider that offers connected services. (Note: not all internet company offer device discounts.) The internet company will provide the discount to the consumer.
