### SECTION 1. Description of Proposed Improvements

The Deep East Texas Council of Governments (DETCOG) is requesting \$98,897,246 in CDBG MIT funds under the Harvey Statewide Mitigation Competition to be used in combination with \$988,973, in local matching funds provided by DETCOG, resulting in a total Project cost of \$99,966,219 for construction/installation of the following broadband communications system infrastructure components;

- a) Capital leases to access/utilize one hundred sixty-six (166) existing cellular communications towers
- b) Installation of eight hundred thirty-five (835) base stations
- c) Installation of seventy-three (73) point-to-point microwave links
- d) Three (3) access connections to the existing internet backbone;
- e) Four hundred eighty-eight (488) miles of aerial fiber optic cable affixed to existing utility poles;
- f) Twenty-nine (29) miles of underground fiber optic cable installed in existing public utility easements;
- g) Eleven (11) Core equipment shelters w/Core equipment;
- h) One hundred sixty-six (166) Edge equipment cabinets w/Edge equipment;
- i) Installation of residential customer access equipment at forty five thousand and eighty (45,080) residential dwellings occupied by Low and Moderate Income households;
- j) Project engineering services; and
- k) Project grant administration services.

# SECTION 2. Proposed Project Budget

Deep East Texas Council of Governments is requesting \$98,897,246 in CDBG MIT funds to be used in combination with \$988,973, in local matching funds provided by DETCOG resulting in a total Project cost of \$99,886,219 for the following broadband telecommunications improvements;


# SECTION 3. Proposed Project Beneficiaries Data and Map

The proposed Project beneficiaries are located within a contiguous area that includes portions of all twelve (12) counties in the DETCOG region. Of the region's twelve counties, three (3) received designation by HUD as MOST IMPACTED AND DISTRESSED (HUD-MID); these are Jasper County, Newton County, and San Jacinto County. Certain zip codes in two (2) additional counties (Tyler County and Polk County) are as also designated as HUD-MID areas. Four counties (Polk County, Sabine County, San Augustine County, Tyler County), were designated by the State of Texas as State Most Impacted and Distressed areas (State-MID). The remaining five counties are non-MID counties.

In summary this application will include improvements located in and serving portions of all three (3) HUD-MID counties, four (4) State-MID counties, and five (5) non-MID counties. DETCOG believes it is important that the Project serve portions of all its counties due to the great need that exists to provide reliable access to broadband service throughout the region. DETCOG is the largest entirely rural Council of Governments region in Texas

DETCOG's proposed Hurricane Harvey Statewide Mitigation Competition Project beneficiaries reside within a total of one hundred fifty-nine (159) contiguous census block groups, with the area depicted by the shaded area on the following map of the DETCOG region:


